



New Wave Lily
Lilium 'New Wave'

Plant Height: 32 inches

Description:

A lovely and large growing variety with pure white blooms and very little spotting in the center; slightly waving petals complete a very elegant presentation that is perfect for garden border plantings, massing, and as a feature point of interest

Ornamental Features

New Wave Lily features bold lightly-scented white trumpet-shaped flowers with black spots at the ends of the stems in mid summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its narrow leaves remain green in colour throughout the season. The fruit is not ornamentally significant.

Landscape Attributes

New Wave Lily is an herbaceous perennial with a rigidly upright and towering form. Its medium texture blends into the garden, but can always be balanced by a couple of finer or coarser plants for an effective composition.

This plant will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should be cut back in late fall in preparation for winter. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Insects
- Disease

New Wave Lily is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Mass Planting
- General Garden Use

Planting & Growing

New Wave Lily will grow to be about 32 inches tall at maturity extending to 4 feet tall with the flowers, with a spread of 18 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 14 inches apart. It tends to be leggy, with a typical clearance of 1 foot from the ground, and should be underplanted with lower-growing perennials. The flower stalks can be weak and so they may require staking in exposed sites or excessively rich soils. It grows at a fast rate, and ideal for pruning to live for approximately 10 years.

This plant does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by multiplication of the underground bulbs; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
